PANJAB UNIVERSITY, CHANDIGARH

1. Regulations for One -Year Diploma Course in Translation in French (effective from the session 2002-2003), in anticipation of the approval of various bodies of the University/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

Diploma in Translation (To take effect from the session 2002-2003)

- 1.1 The duration of the Diploma in Translation (in French) shall be one academic year.
- 1.2 The examination shall be held once a year ordinarily in the month of May, or such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 1.3 The last date for receipt of examination admission forms and fees without and with late fee (as fixed by the Syndicate), shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 2.1 Admission to the course shall be open to candidates having done:
 - 1) B.A. Part II with elective or Honours in French; <u>OR</u>
 Diploma in French offered by the Department of French, Panjab University <u>OR</u>
 DELF-2 (Diploma Elementaries de la langue Frencaise-2).
 - 2) It is also open to candidates who have paassed equivalent examinations of another University or institution of learning subject to approval of the Syndicate, Panjab University.
- 2.2 A student who has been admitted to the course under Regulation 2.1 has been on the rolls of the University Department of French and produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department shall be eligible to appear in the examination;
 - (a) of good character;
 - (b) of having attended not less than 75 per cent of lectures in each paper delievered during the academic year preceding the examination.
- 2.3 A deficiency in the number of lecturess may be condoned-
 - (i) up to 15 lectures by the Head of the Department;
 - (ii) up to 25 lectures by the Dean of University Instruction on the recommendation of the Head of the Department.
- A student who having completed the prescribed course, does not appear in the examination or having appeared in the examination has failed, may be permitted, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department, to appear in the examination as a private candidate within a period of three years of completing such course.
- The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate shall be as fixed by the Syndicate.
- 5.1 The examination shall be held in accordance with the syllabus approved by the Academic Council.
- 5.2 The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be:
 - a) 40 per cent in each paper i.e. Theory/Oral/Viva/Practical.
 - b) 45 per cent in the aggreagte.
- 6 The medium of examination shall be French/English(as per provision in the approved syllabus).

- 7.1 Successful candidates shall be classified as under:
 - a) Those who obtain 60 per cent or more of the ... First Division. aggregate marks
 - b) Those who obtain 50 per cent or more but less than Second Division. 60 per cent of the aggregate marks
 - c) Those who obtain less than 50 per cent of the ... Third Division. aggregate marks
- 7.2 The Controller of Examinations shall publish the result four weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon as possible.
- 7.3 Each successful candidate shall be granted a Certificate showing the division in which he has passed together with the marks obtained by him and the aggregate marks.

Regulations for One -Year Postgraduate Diploma in Mass Communication in the Department of Correspondence Studies (effective from the session 2002-2003), in anticipation of the approval of various bodies of the University/Government of India/publication in the Government of India gazette.

REGULATIONS AND SCHEME FOR ONE-YEAR POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN MASS COMMUNICATION (PGDMC) THROUGH CORRESPONDENCE STUDIES

- 1. The Department of Correspondence Studies, Panjab University, shall undertake instruction for the Post Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication. The duration of the course shall be one academic year.
- 2. The Board of Studies in Mass Communication (Post-Graduate) of the Faculty of Arts, Panjab University, Chandigarh will function as the Board of Studies for this Post-graduate Diploma. Chairperson of the Department of Correspondence Studies, will be a member of the said Board whenever required for the purpose.
- 3. The examination shall ordinarily be held at the end of the academic year on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 4. That last date for the receipt of enrolment forms and examination admission forms, with or without late fees, shall be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 5. The Examination fee and enrolment fee, to be paid by the candidate, shall be as prescribed from time to time.
- 6. The admission to the course shall be open to any person who has passed the Bachelor's Degree examination in any faculty from Panjab University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.
- 7. The medium of instruction shall be English.
- 8. The medium of Examination shall be English/Hindi/Punjabi.
- 9. In all, there will be five papers of 100 marks each, out of which four papers will be of theory and one paper of practical assignments.
- 10. Student will have to submitt practical assignments in the form of portfolio within ten days of termination of the theory examination. No assignments will be accepted thereafter and the candidates defaulter in this regard will be treated as absent in this paper. Submission of the assignments after the expiry of the stipulated period will be counted towards the next subsequent examination.
- 11. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be (i) 35 per cent in each paper in the University examination and (ii) 40% in aggregate.

- 12. Grace marks may be given in accordance with the University regulations.
- 13. A candidate who obtains 40 per cent of the aggregate number of marks in all the papers but fails in not more than two papers, obtaining not less than 25% of the marks each in these papers, may be admitted to the supplementary examination in these papers to be held in the month of September/October of the same year, or if he fails to pass or present himself for that examination, then at the next annual examination. If he obtains 35% marks in these papers in the University examination, he shall be declared to have passed the examination.
- 14. Such a candidate shall be required to pay admission fee for the whole examination and shall not be eligible for a prize or a medal. A candidate who fails to pass or to appear in the two chances allowed, shall be declared to have failed in the whole examination and must appear in all papers if he desires to take examination again.
- 15. A candidate who fails to qualify in this examination in three consecutive examinations shall not be allowed to continue his studies in the course.
- 16. Successful candidates securing 75% or more of aggregate number of marks shall be placed in the first division with Distinction, those who secure 60% or more but less than 75% shall be placed in the first division, those who secure 50% but less than 60% shall be placed in the second division and those who secure less than 50% shall be placed in the third division.
- 17. Four weeks after the termaination of the examination or as soon thereafter, as possible the Controller of Examinations shall publish a list of candidates who have passed, showing the division in which they have passed.
- 18. Each successful candidate shall be granted Postgraduate Diploma in Mass Communication showing the division in which he has passed.

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3. Regulations for M.Sc. (Bio-Technology) (2 -Year Course) (semester system) (effective form the admissions of 2001) in anticipation of the approval of various bodies of the University/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

M.Sc. (Bio-Tech.)

1. ADMISSION

A person with the following qualifications from the Panjab University or any other University/Institution recognized by the Panjab University shall be eligible to join the course:

Bachelor's degree (under the 10+2+3 pattern of education) in Physical, Biological, Pharmaceutical, Agricultural, veterinary or Fishery Sciences or Bachelor's degree in Engineering/Technology, Home Science, Medicine (MBBS) from any University/Institute recognized by the Panjab University. The candidates must have obtained at least 55% marks at the Bachelor's degree level.

2. DURATION OF PROGRAMME:

- a) The duration of the course of M.Sc. Bio-technology (semester system) will be two years comprising four semesters.
- b) The duration, including end semester examination, of the first semester and third semester will be from August to December and that of the second and fourth semester from January to May, during the respective academic years, including end semester examination.

c) Each semester will be followed by end semester which will be held after 36 lectures in each paper/course.

3. INSTRUCTION:

- a) For every theory paper/course, 3-4 lectures (including tutorial) each of one hour duration, per week will be delivered. The tutorial will involve active, participation by the students in the work of problem solving, discussion or test question and assignments concerned with the lectures, etc.
- b) The teacher for a course is responsible for maintaining the desired standard of the course and for evaluating student's performance. Each course is a distinct entity and the student is required to pass in each course/paper for the final award of degree.
- c) In case of more than one teacher for a course, one teacher is designated as teacher-incharge who coordinates the instruction and evaluation in the course.
- d) The laboratory course has a team of teachers/instructors with a teacher-in-charge.
- e) Students are expected to fulfil the attendance requirements (66% at present) as per University <u>rules</u> and regulaions.

4. ASSESSMENT:

- a) The total number of marks/credits for each semester, the number of theory papers and practicals, the marks/credits allotted for each paper the syllabi and courses of study will be decided by the Board of Control from time to time.
- b) The assessment will be wholly internal for all theory papers. For laboratory courses, it may be wholly internal or there may be an internal examiner.
- c) In a theory course/paper, 25% of the total marks will be for in-semester assessment and 75% for end-semester examination.
- d) In a theory course/paper, the answer-books of the in-semester tests will be returned to the students and for end-semester examination will be available to students for perusal according to the schedule which will be announced by the department/teacher.
- e) In a laboratory course 50% marks will be meant for in semester assessment which will depend on the following:
 - i) The skill of the student in doing the experiments.
 - ii) Viva-voce on the experiments.
 - iii) Written report on the experiments, and
 - iv) Seminar delivered by the student.

The examination may be fixed at the end of each semester or at the end of the academic year. It will carry the remaining 50% of marks for the laboratory course. There may be an external examiner alongwith one or two internal examiners. In case the examiner is not available, he may be replaced by an other examiner from the department.

If the Board of Control decides to have continuous semester assessment for all 100% marks of the laboratory courses, they may be allowed to do so.

f) Pass Marks

The students are required to obtain 40% marks in each course of theory/laboratory to pass in that course in each semester.

5. RE-EXAMINATION

- (a) If a student fails to getpass marks in a theory/laboratory course/paper or has missed the end semester examination in any semester, he/she will be given a reappear in the course. All reappear examinations will be held immediately after the end of the summer vacation, before the start of the regular classes.
- (b) If a student fails in the reexamination in more than 50% of the total credits, in both the semesters of the relevant year, he/she will not be promoted to the next class sand will have to seek readmission into the same class for the next academic year.
- (c) The facility of readmission of a student to M.Sc. programme cannot be extended beyond one year i.e. the time limit for completing M.Sc. programme is three years from his/her first admission to the programme. If the student is unable to pass all the courses in three years, he/she has to leave M.Sc. programme and will not be readmitted in the same programme.
- 6. The Board of Control would take appropriate steps for the proper implementation of all aspects of the M.Sc. programme, including the time schedules of instruction and assessment, conduct of examinations, seminar, project, etc.

4. Regulations for Advanced Diploma in Persian be the same as prescribed for advanced Diploma in Urdu (effective from the session 2000-2001), in anticipation of the approval of various bodies of the University/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

Provided that the candidates shall have to pay an extra late fee of Rs.50 after the stipulated last date with a late fee of Rs.5 is over. No candidate shall be permitted to deposit extra late fee directly with the University.

- 2. A person who has passed one of the following examinations with at least 55 per cent marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and English (all taken as compulsory subjects) shall be eligible to join the course:-
 - (a) +2 examination of the 10+2 system being conducted by the Punjab School Education Board.

- (c) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a), (b) or (c).

Provided that a candidate will be eligible for admission to the B.Architecture Course if, before applying, he had qualified in the four subjects of English, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics with at least 55% marks in aggregate even if he had qualified in any one of these as additional subjects after passing the relevant examination.

Provided further that the concerned subject in which the candidate had qualified as additional subject is exactly of the same standard as that of the four subjects, namely Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and English, which he is required to have passed in qualifying examination as prescribed under (a), (b) and (c) for admission to the B. Architecture Course.

- 3.1 A candidate shall be promoted from one semester to the next semester provided he qualified in at least five subjects prescribed for the respective semester examination, fulfils the attendance and other requirements and complete practical training in the seventh semester (for promotion from seventh to eighth semester).
- 3.2 A candidate who is relegated in any subject/s in any semester (provided he is not required to repeat the semester) shall be permitted to continue the studies for the next semester and appear in the relegated subject/s in the next examination, provided that in any examination, a candidate shall be allowed to appear at a time in a backlog of not more than 5 subjects of previous semesters.

Regulations for B.E. Courses being offered under P.U. Department of Chemical Engineering & Technology and U.I.E.T (effective from the session 2005-2006), in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/Publication in the Government of India Gazette .

- 1. The duration of the course of instruction for Bachelor of Engineering in any of the disciplines shall be four years. The teaching period will be divided in 8 semesters of approximately 15 weeks each.
- 2. The mode of admission to the First Semester course in any branch will be decided by the Syndicate. It will be open to a candidate who has passed 10+2 examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi or its equivalent with Physics and Mathematics as Compulsory subjects along with one of the following subjects: Chemistry, Biotechnology, Computer Science or Biology.
- 3. A student shall be eligible to appear in the examination only if he has attended at least 75% of total classes held as mentioned above during the semester. The attendance shall be certified by the Chairperson of University Department(s)/Director of Institute/Principal of College as the case may be.
- 4. A candidate who does not fulfil the attendance requirements in any subject will have to repeat the course of instruction in that subject.
- 5. (a) A candidate shall be allowed to join next higher semester provided he/she has undergone regular course of studies in all the previous semesters in the sequential order.
 - (b) The candidate will be admitted to eighth semester if he/she has cleared first semester.
- 6. (a) In addition to the regular papers prescribed for the semester, a candidate appearing in a particular semester examination for the first time will be allowed to appear in a maximum of 10 subjects of lower semester/semesters of which not more than 5 should be theory papers and not more than 5 should be practical papers.
 - (b) A candidate shall be allowed a maximum of 4 attempts to appear in any semester examination. These attempts will be spread over four successive University examinations for odd semesters in November/December and for even semester April/May. If a candidate does not avail any chance to appear in any examination, whatever may be the reason, he/she will not be allowed the relaxation in duration of four years.
 - (c) A candidate shall be required to pass in all the subjects of B.E. course, where minimum pass marks are prescribed in a maximum duration of 7 academic years counted from academic session in which candidate is admitted in B.E. first semester. If a candidate fails to pass the examination in the period of 7 academic years, his/her candidature will stand cancelled automatically. This period of 7 academic years will also include the entire period duration which he/she has suspended his/her studies on his/her own or has failed in the examination or debarred by University from taking any examination.
- 7. A candidate will be deemed to have passed in a subject if he/she obtains 40% marks in the subject (40% marks in the University examination and 40% marks in the internal sessionals separately) in theory as well as non-theory papers.
- 8. If the candidate fails in University examination in a subject, he/she will have to reappear in subsequent University examinations for that subject.
- 9. A candidate will be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Engineering on passing all the subjects prescribed for the degree.

 - i) Those who obtain 70 per cent or more of the aggregate
- First Division with Honours

ITEM 4

Regulations for Master of Fine Arts (Two-Year Course) (effective from the session 2003-04) in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/Publication in Government of India Gazette.

- 1. The duration of the courses leading to the Degree of MFA (Painting), MFA(Graphics-Printmaking), MFA (Sculpture) and MFA (Applied Art) shall be two years. Annual Examinations of 1st year and Final year of Master of Fine Arts (MFA) shall be conducted by the Panjab University. These examinations will be held once in a year ordinarily in the month of April/May or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 2. A candidate who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the Course:
 - (i) Candidates seeking admission to the MFA Courses must have passed the Bachelor of Fine Arts Examination of Panjab University or an examination recognized equivalent thereto with 50% or more marks in the aggregate.

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- (ii) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) above with at least 50% marks in the aggregate.
- 3. A candidate who has obtained a minimum of 45% marks in the practical of each subject and has obtained not less than 20% marks in theory papers may be admitted to a supplementary examination of the same year or along with his annual examination of the higher class simultaneously. Such a candidate will be required to pay the examination fee per subject as prescribed by the University from time to time as fee for the supplementary as well as for annual examination. If he does not clear the theory paper/s concerned in the supplementary examination or along with the annual examination for the next higher class, he shall be reverted to the lower class. However, a candidate who does not obtain pass marks in any of the practical papers will be declared fail in the examination and shall be required to rejoin in the course of study afresh for one academic year in order to become eligible for appearing at the examination in a subsequent year, if otherwise eligible.
- 4. A candidate will be eligible to join the Final Year Class of the course only after he has passed the MFA First Year Examination.
- 5. The First year and Final year MFA Examination shall be open to a candidate who possesses the qualifications as laid down in Regulations 1.2 and 2.4 and produces a certificate signed by the Principal of the College.

- (a) Of having been on the rolls of the college affiliated for the course during the academic year preceding the examination.
- (b) Of having obtained not less than 50% marks of the total aggregate marks of sessional work in all practical subjects.
- (c) Of having attended not less than 75% of the lectures and practicals in each subject delivered during each year of the course of study.
- 6. The minimum marks required to pass each examination shall be held at the end of each year shall separately be 35% in each theory paper and 45 per cent in practical paper consisting of sessional and examination marks taken together.
- 7. The successful candidates shall be classified as under:
 - (i) Those who obtain 75 per cent or more of the aggregate marks, shall be placed in the First Division with Distinction.
 - (ii) Those who obtain 60 per cent or more but less than 75 per cent of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the First Division.
 - (iii) Those who obtain 50 per cent or more but less than 60 per cent of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the Second division.
 - (iv) Those who obtain less than 50 per cent of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the Third Division.
- 8. A candidate who does not clear the Final Examination within a period of three years of his admission to the First year shall not be allowed to continue his studies for MFA.

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ITEM 5

Regulations for Master of Library and Information Science (Semester System) (Two-Year Course) (effective from the session 2003-04) in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/Publication in Government of India Gazette.

- 1.1 Under the semester system of the duration of two years, each academic year shall consist of two semesters First and Third semester shall be from July to December while Second and fourth Semesters shall be from January to May, respectively or as decided by the University. The instructional period for each semester will extend over a period of 16 weeks followed by preparatory holidays for one week and thereafter the semester examination.
- 1.2 A student who has failed in any paper shall be eligible to clear the same in a supplementary examination which may be held preferably in May and December, respectively.
- 2. The minimum qualifications for admission to the course for the degree of Master of Library and Information Science (Two –Year integrated Course, Semester System) shall be:
 - (a) Bachelor's degree with at least 50 per cent marks in the aggregate from this university or from any other university the Bachelor's degree of which has been recognized by the Syndicate; or
 - (b) Master's degree from this university or from any other university the Master's degree of which has been recognized by this University; or
 - (c) B.A. degree of the University through O.T./ Modern Indian Language (M.I.L.) and English only examinations, in which case the aggregate of 50 per cent

- marks shall be calculated for taking into account the marks obtained in English and the elective subjects taken together; or
- (d) Any other qualification recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) above.
- 3. The examination for the semester shall be open to a regular student who is certified by the Chairperson of the Department of Library and Information Science and produces the following certificates:
 - (a) of good character;
 - (b) of having been on the rolls of the University department of Library and Information Science during one semester preceding the examination;
 - (c) of having attended not less than 75 per cent of the lectures delivered, tutorials and /or practical classes held separately in each paper during the semester preceding the examination.
- 4. The minimum marks required to pass the examination shall be 50 per cent (a) in each paper, and (b) Internal Assessment separately.
- 5. A candidate who fails in a semester examination but obtains pass marks in a paper or papers shall be exempted from reappearing in such paper or papers. He/she may be allowed to join the next semester provisionally and to appear in the subsequent semester examination simultaneously in May and/or December.
- 6. If a candidate gets reappear in a particular paper or papers, he/she shall be allowed a maximum of three more consecutive chances to pass the same. However, in case he/she unable to pass in the said paper/s after availing all the permissible chances, his/her result shall be cancelled.
- 7.(a) A candidate who secures 75 per cent or more marks in a paper shall be awarded distinction in that paper.
 - (b) The divisions will be awarded as follows:
 - i) Those who obtain 70 per cent or more of the aggregate
- First Division with distinction
- ii) Those who obtain 60 per cent and above but less than 70 per cent of the aggregate marks.
- First Division.
- iii) Those who obtain 50 per cent and above but less than 60 per cent of the aggregate marks.
- Second Division.
- iv) Those who obtain less than 50%
- Third Division.
- 8 Each successful candidate shall receive a diploma showing the division in which he/she has passed the examination for the degree of Master of Library & Information Science.
- 9. A candidate who has passed the Master of Library & Information Science examination from the Panjab University may reappear as a private candidate in a paper/s he/she wishes to, with a view to improving the previous performance. For this purpose, he/she may be given two chances, within a period of five years from the date of his/her passing the degree course. If he/she does not improve his/her performance in any paper/s, he/she will be eligible to do so in the following years in the semester examinations concerned which shall be treated as a second chance. The candidate shall be charged the fee as prescribed by the University for each Course, subject to the minimum examination fee prescribed for the semester concerned.

Regulations for Post-M.Sc. Diploma in Accelerator Physics (effective from the session 2005-2006) in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/Publication in Government of India Gazette.

DURATION

1. The duration of the course for Post- M.Sc. Diploma in Accelerator Physics shall be one year comprising two semesters. The examination of first semester will be held in the month of December and that of the second semester in April/May or on such other dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.

ADMISSION

- 2. The minimum qualification for admission to the diploma shall be -
 - (i) Master degree in Science of Panjab University in Physics/Applied Physics

or

- (ii) Any other examination recognized by Panjab University equivalent to the above examination.
- 3. The admission will be to the First semester of the PMDAP. The admission will be governed by the regulations/rules approved by the University from time to time.
- 4. Every candidate admitted to PMDAP course shall pay admission fee and tuition fee and examination fee for each semester of an academic year to the University as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 5. The first and second semester examination shall be open to a regular candidate who -
 - (i) has been on the rolls of the Department of Physics during first and second semester for the diploma course, respectively preceding the examination.
 - (ii) has attended not less than 75 per cent lectures and practicals delivered in each subject of the prescribed course for the first and second semester examination, a deficiency of attendance may be condoned as per University rules.
- 6. A student must pass all prescribed examinations in maximum two academic sessions from the date of admission in the course in order to be eligible for the award of diploma. Subject to the above a student who secures less than 40 per cent marks in any subject may be allowed to reappear in one or more subjects as specified.
- 7. All the reappear examinations will be held along with the regular examinations in December/April or any other dates approved by the Board of Control in Physics as per University rules.

<u>ITEM 7</u>

Regulations for B.A. LL.B. (Honours) Course (effective from the admissions of 2004-2005) in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

- 1. B.A. LL.B. (Honours) shall be 5-year integrated course comprising of 10 semesters. Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters:
 - (i) From July to December.
 - (ii) From January to May.
- 2. Minimum qualification for admission to First Semester of the course shall be -

- (a) 10+2 Examination of Punjab or Haryana Board of School Education/CBSE/ICSE or any other Board/University recognized as equivalent to it with at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST.)
- (b) The candidate must not be above 20 years of age as on 1st August of the year in which admission is sought to the First Semester (22 years in case of SC/ST).
- (c) The admission shall be on such criteria (academic merit or entrance test or both etc.) as may be prescribed by the Syndicate from time to time.
- 3. A candidate admitted to the course shall be eligible to appear in a semester examination if he/she has attended at least 75% of the lectures/special/lectures/Tutorials/Moots/visits to Court or other institutions etc. as may be delivered or arranged during the semester.

Provided that deficiency in the attendance requirement may be condoned as follows:

- (a) Up to 15 lectures in a paper(s) to the best advantage of the student and up to 10 lectures in various special lectures/Moots/visits to Courts or other institutions by the Head/Chairman/Director/Principal.
- (b) The Vice-Chancellor in exceptional cases, on the recommendation of the Head/Chairman/Director/Principal, may condone up to 10 lectures in a paper(s) to the best advantage of the student, beyond the condonation done by the Head/Chairman/Director/Principal.
- 4. To be declared pass in a semester examination, a candidate must have obtained at least
 - i) 45% marks in each paper of the semester examination.
 - ii) 45% marks in the internal assessment/Moots/Project report/visits to Courts or other institutions, etc. for each paper. These marks shall be on such basis/criteria as approved by the Syndicate from time to time.
- 5. (i) Promotion from 1st to 2nd, 3rd to 4th, 5th to 6th, 7th to 8th and 9th to 10th semester shall be allowed to a candidate who has fulfilled the attendance and other requirements even though he/she has failed/has failed to appear in the examination for the semester respectively from which he is being promoted.
 - (ii) Promotion from 2^{nd} to 3^{rd} , 4^{th} to 5^{th} , 6^{th} to 7^{th} , 8^{th} to 9^{th} semester shall be allowed only if he/she has passed at least 60% of the papers of the 1^{st} & 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} & 4^{th} , 5^{th} & 6^{th} , 7^{th} & 8^{th} semesters respectively as the case may be.
 - (iii) A candidate who gets re-appear in a paper(s) may pass the same in the next two consecutive chances, provided that the Vice-Chancellor may, on the recommendation of the Head/Chairman/Director/Principal, may, as a special case and for justified reasons, allow one additional consecutive chance.
 - (iv) All the papers of the 5 year course must be passed within 8 years from the date of admission to the 1st semester of the course.
 - (v) On passing all the 10 semester examinations a candidate will be placed on the basis of aggregate marks of all 10 semester examinations as under:

50% or above but below 60% marks
60% or above but below 75% marks

(vi) The aggregate percentage of marks of all 10 semesters obtained shall be entered in the degree to be awarded by the University.

- iv) has obtained at least 40 per cent marks in the internal assessment of each subject.
- 7. The minimum per cent of marks required to appear in and pass the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester examinations shall be as follows in each case.
 - i) 40 per cent in the total of the internal assessment part and the university examination whether theory or practical (including project work. etc.) as a prerequisite to appear in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester examinations, and
 - ii) 50 per cent in the total of the internal assessment part and the University examination part of every subject separately of the examination, whether theory or practicals (including project work etc. for passing the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester Examination;
 - iii) A student who does not obtain 40 per cent marks in the internal assessment part of every subject separately of the First, Second, Third and Fourth semester shall be required to again study the subject, submit Assignments appear in class test and present seminar prescribed for that semester in the next academic session before being allowed to appear in the University examination as approved by the Principal of the College subject to the restriction that a student must complete all course requirements and pass all prescribed examinations within a maximum period of four academic sessions from the original date of joining the course in order to be eligible for the award of the Degree.
 - iv) If a student gets re-appear in a paper/s then the students have to appear as a reappear candidate along with the regular students. There shall be no special reappear examination.
- 8. Grace marks shall be given at the rate of one per cent of the aggregate marks of all subjects of the First, Second, Third and fourth Semester examinations, as the case may be. A candidate may avail of the grace marks either in the aggregate or in one or more papers, as may be his/her advantage. Grace marks, shall, however be given only for passing the examination or for earning a higher division and not for improving internal assessment or for passing the examination with distinction.
- 9. The student must complete all course requirements and pass all prescribed examinations in maximum four academic sessions from the date of joining the course in order to be eligible for award of the Degree. Subject to the above, a student may be allowed to re-appear in one or more subjects as specified below:
 - i) A candidate who, having obtained the pre-requisite marks in the internal assessment part of every subject of the first and second semester examination under Regulation 7 (i), appears in the First and Second semester examination but fails to pass the examination under Regulation 7(ii), may be allowed to study in the third semester of the Second year of the course and to re-appear in all or some of the subjects of the first and second semester examination along with the subjects of the third and fourth semester of the examination. The subjects in which the candidate shall be eligible to re-appear shall be only those in which he/she has obtained less than 50 per cent marks in the total of the Internal Assessment part and the University examination part (Internal assessment marks shall be reassessed, but shall be carried over). If/she still fails to clear the first and second semester examination, his result of the third and fourth semester examination shall be withheld, till all subjects prescribed for the First and second semester examination has been cleard by him/her.
 - (ii) A candidate who having obtained the pre-requisite marks in the internal assessment part of every subject of 3rd & 4th semester of Second Year examination under Regulation 7(i), appears, in the 3rd & 4th semester of Second Year examination but fails to pass the examination under Regulation 7(ii), may be allowed to re-appear in all or some of the subjects of the third and fourth semester examination along with the regular students of the next academic session. The subjects in which the candidate shall be eligible to re-appear shall be only those in which he/she has obtained less than 50 per cent marks in the

total of the Internal Assessment part and the University examination part (Internal Assessment marks shall not be reassessed, but shall be carried over).

- The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint the paper setters on the recommendation of the Board of Studies for the setting of question papers in the subjects of M.Sc.(IT).
- 11. The Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Board of Studies, whether external or internal, shall appoint examiners for all subjects. A committee of three internal examiners appointed by the Vice-Chancellor shall do the evaluation of the project work.
- **12.** The result of the examinations shall be prepared and declared by the Controller of Examinations.
- **13.** Successful candidates shall be classified as under:
 - Those who obtain 75 per cent or more of the total aggregate marks of all the First i) & Second, Third & Fourth Semester examinations taken together: First division distinction, provided that the candidate had passed all the examinations/subjects in the first attempt.
 - Those who obtain 60 per cent or more, but less than 75 per cent of the total ii) aggregate marks of all the First & Second, Third & Fourth semester examinations taken together:
 - Those who obtain less than 60 per cent of the total aggregate marks of all the iii) First & Second, Third & Fourth semester examinations taken together: Second division.

Appendix to Item No. 28

REGULATIONS FOR CERTIFICATE COURSE IN VIVEKANANDA STUDIES (To be effective from the academic Session 2003-2004)

- The duration of the Certificate Course in Vivekananda Studies shall be one academic year. The course may be undertaken through the Department of Correspondence Studies or at the Inter-Disciplinary centre for Vivekananda Studies (Evening Classes).
- Admission to the course shall be open to persons who have passed at least +2 examination from a Board/University/Council recognized by the Panjab University or a higher examination. The students and teachers of the Colleges and Universities shall also be eligible for admission.
- The admission/examination/ other fees, funds and charges shall be as decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- The examination may be held once a year ordinarily in the month of April/May on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- The medium of examination shall be English or Punjabi or Hindi. The lessons for the 5. candidates of Correspondence studies shall be available in English only.
- The date of commencement of the examination and the last date for receipt of admission form and fee (a) without late fee, and (b) with late fee as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time, shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- The examination shall be open to a student whose name has been sent by the Head of the Department of Correspondence Studies/Coordinator of the Inter-Disciplinary Centre for Vivekananda Studies (Evening Classes) and who
 - has been on the rolls of the Department/Centre during the academic year (i) preceding the examination; and

- (ii) (a) in the case of the students of Correspondence Studies has sent at least 50 per cent of the response sheets to the Department of Correspondence Studies.*
 - (b) in the case of the students of the Inter-Disciplinary Centre for Vivekananda Studies (Evening Classes) has attended not less than 75% of the lectures delivered in each paper. **
 - * A deficiency in the required number of response sheet may be condoned by the Head of the Department of Correspondence Studies as per rules framed by the Syndicate from time to time.
 - ** A deficiency in the required number of lectures may be condoned as under:

(a) up to 15 lectures : by the coordinator of the

Centre.

(b) up to 25 lectures : by the Dean of University

Instruction.

- **8.** A student on the rolls of the Department/Centre who does not appear in the examination or having appeared has failed, may be permitted, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Correspondence Studies/Coordinator of the Inter-Disciplinary Centre for Vivekananda Studies (Evening Classes), to appear in the examination as a late Department/Centre student, within a period of three years of completing the course.
- **9.** The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be 35 percent in each paper and 40 per cent in the aggregate.
- **10.1** The successful candidates shall be classified into three divisions as under:

(a) Those who obtain 60 per cent or more of : First Division

the aggregate number of marks

: Second Division

(b) Those who obtain 50 per cent or more but less than 60 per cent of the aggregate number of marks.

Third Division

(c) Those who obtain less than 50 per cent of the aggregate number of marks.

10.2 Four weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon as possible, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the examination.

10.2 Each successful candidate shall be granted a certificate showing the division in which he/she has passed together with the marks obtained by him/her and the aggregate marks.

 - (f) B.Com./B.Sc. or any Bachelor degree from Panjab University;

- 3.1 A person who possess the qualification laid down in Regulation 2 and produces the following certificates signed by the Chairman of the Chinese and Tibetan languages, Panjab University or by the Principal of the College affiliated for the course, as the case may be, eligible to appear in the examination;

Regulations for the Four-Year Integrated Course B.A., B.El.Ed./B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.Ed. (effective from the session 2007-08) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

Regulations for Four-Year Integrated Course (8 Semesters)
B.A., B.El.Ed./B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.Ed.

- 1. B.A.B.Ed. 4-Year Integrated Course shall be Self-financing Course.
- 2. B.A.B.Ed. shall be a 4 years integrated course comprising of 8 semesters.

Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters:

- a) From July to December
- b) From January to May.
- 3. Minimum qualifications for admission to First Semester of the Course shall be:
 - a) 10+2 Examination of any Board/University which Panjab University recognizes as equivalent to it with at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST).
 - b) The candidate must not have more than 20 years of age as on 1st August of the year in which admission is sought to the First Semester (22 years in case of SC/ST).
 - c) The admission shall be on such criteria (academic merit or entrance test or both etc.) as may be prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 4. Every candidate admitted to the course shall pay such fees and funds or other charges as may be prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 5. A candidate admitted to the course shall be eligible to appear in a Semester examination if he has attended at least 75% of the lectures required in prescribed course component during the semester. Provided that the deficiency in this attendance requirement may be condoned as follows:
 - a) Up to 15 lectures in a paper(s) to the best advantage of the student and up to 10 lectures in various special lectures/visits to schools or other institutions by the Head/Chairperson/Director.
 - b) The Vice-Chancellor in exceptional cases, on the recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/Director may condone up to 10 lectures in a paper(s) to the best

advantage of the student, beyond the condonation done by the Head/Chairperson/Director.

- 6. To be declared pass in a semester examination, a candidate must have obtained at least:
 - a) 50% marks in each paper of the semester examination.
 - b) 50% marks in the internal assessment/project reports/term papers/visits to schools or other institutions etc., for each paper. These marks shall be on such basis/criteria as approved by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - c) All papers will consist of 100 marks i.e. 80 marks for theory and 20 marks for internal assessment.
- 7. (i) Promotion from 1st to 2nd, 3rd to 4th, 5th to 6th and 7th to 8th semester shall be allowed if a candidate who has fulfilled the attendance and other requirements even though who has failed/has failed to appear in the examination for the semester respectively from which he is being promoted.
 - (ii) promotion from 2nd to 3rd, 4th to 5th, and 6th to 7th semester shall be allowed only if he has passed at least 60% of the papers of the 1st to 2nd, 3rd to 4th, and 5th to 6th semesters respectively as the case may be.
 - (iii) A candidate who gets reappear in paper(s) may pass the same in a total of two consecutive chances irrespective of promotion. However, where a student has cleared 80% of the papers of all the semesters preceding the semester in which he has to be admitted, he will be entitled to avail one more chance to clear the remaining papers on the recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/Director, if the candidate fails to clear remaining papers even after availing all these (three in all) chances, he will seek fresh admission in First Semester (through entrance test for the first semester only) provided he is eligible to continue as per rules. (This Para was substituted by the Syndicate in its meeting held on 24.9.2006, Agenda Item 71).
 - (iv) All the papers of the 4 years course must be passed within 7 years from the date of the admission to the first semester of the course.
 - (v) On passing all the 8 semesters' examination a candidate will be placed on the basis of aggregate marks of all 8 semesters' examination as under:
 - -50% or above but below 60% marks –IInd Division
 - -60% or above but below 75% marks -Ist Division
 - -75% or above marks -Ist Division with Distinction.
 - (vi) The aggregate percentage of marks of all 8 semesters obtained shall be entered in the DMC/degree to be awarded by the University
- 8. The medium of instructions and examination shall be English/Hindi/Punjabi.
- 9. The teaching learning processes will be as follows:
 - a) In all the papers 50% academic Transactions will be Teacher Directed by way of Lectures, Discussions and Presentations by the Teachers.

- b) In all the papers the remaining 50% will be covered in the form of Individualised Sessional Work (supervised by the concerned teachers) comprising Project Work, Team Presentations, Individual Term Papers and Seminar.
- c) Students would be grouped in teams of 10 students with one teacher in tutorial groups.
- d) The Individualized Sessional Work shall be adjudged by a team of teachers comprising two internal and one external examiner.
- e) The pedagogy would be determined according to the course requirements (both Academic Subjects and Specialized Pedagogy).
- 10. The Basic Structure of the 4-Year Integrated Course in B.A.B.Ed. would be divided into three components. During the first two years the Panjab University prescribed syllabus for B.A. will be taken up as it is (for compulsory and elective subjects).

- 6.1 Save as provided in Regulations 5 and 8 of this Chapter, a Selection Committee shall consist of the following members to recommend persons for appointment as Professors or Readers:
- (i) The Vice-Chancellor to be the Chairperson.
- (ii) Three Experts in the concerned subject/field out of the list recommended by the Vice-Chancellor and approved by the Syndicate.
- (iii) An academician who is nominee of the Chancellor.
- (iv) The Dean of the concerned Faculty.
- (v) Head/Chairperson of the concerned Department. The Chairperson not below the rank of Professor should sit in the Selection Committee. If Chairperson is not Professor, the senior most Professor would be the member of the Selection Committee. In the absence of any Professor in the Department, the Dean of University Instruction would be the member of the Selection Committee.

A representative of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, Women and Physically Handicapped person shall be in the Selection Committee whenever a candidate from any of these categories appears for the interview.

The process of selection shall involve inviting the biodata and reprints of Three major publications of candidates for the post of Professor and Reader (in the case of candidates for the post of Professor one of the publications could be a book or research project) before interview and getting them assessed by the same three external experts who are to be invited to interview the candidates.

Regulations of M.Tech. (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) course, and be given effect to from the admissions of 2005 in anticipation of the approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

1.1 The duration of the course for the degree of M.Tech. (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) for regular candidates shall be four semesters (24 months). The maximum period in which a candidate must qualify for the degree shall be four academic years, failing which he/she shall not be allowed to continue his/her studies for the course. Provided that this limit shall not apply to the thesis/dissertation for which the maximum period shall be given as in Regulation 6.1.

The course for the degree of M.Tech. (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) shall have two semesters in a year. The examination for each semester shall be held in December/January and May/June or on dates fixed by the Syndicate.

2.2 (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.

- (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges, for a semester and thesis/dissertation examination to be paid by the candidates shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- A person holding the following qualifications shall be eligible for admission to M. Tech. (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) courses:

Bachelor's degree (4 years after 10+2) in Engineering/Technology i.e. B.E./B.Tech. (in any branch) with minimum 50% marks in aggregate.

Or

Master's degree in any Science subject, having qualified B.Sc. examination with Physics and Mathematics.

- 4. A student who possesses the qualifications laid down in Regulation 3 has remained on the rolls of the University Department in M.Tech. (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) course for the academic term of the semester concerned and produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department shall be eligible to appear in the examination in that semester:
 - (i) of good character;
 - (ii) of having attended for each subject, not less than 75% of the lectures and 75% of the total sessional work in tutorials, design, laboratory work and seminars, and
 - (iii) of having acquitted himself/herself creditably in all the exercises or periodical examinations conducted by the Department from time to time.
- 5. Every candidate shall be required to offer for examination:
 - (a) Theory papers out of the list approved by the concerned faculty from time to time.
 - (b) a thesis/dissertation, of which four neatly typed or printed copies properly bound, shall be submitted to the University.
- 6.1 The candidate shall submit the thesis/dissertation at any time provided that he/she has appeared in all Theory papers. The result of the thesis/dissertation shall be declared after the candidate passes in all the courses offered. In case the candidate's thesis/dissertation is rejected or he/she is unable to complete the thesis/ dissertation in the Fourth Semester, he/she will be allowed up to two years at the maximum for submission of thesis/dissertation or its revision.

Provided further that extension beyond the above limit but not exceeding one year may be allowed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Head of the Department.

6.2 There shall be a viva voce test on the subject matter of the thesis/dissertation. The examiners may, if they consider it necessary, also require the candidate to undergo a written and/or a practical test.

The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be:

- (a) 40 per cent in each theory paper;
- (b) 50 per cent in the Sessional part of each paper;
- (c) Both the Theory examinations and Sessional examinations will be considered independent of each other. Aggregate pass percentage will be 50%.
- 7.2 Subject to Regulation 6.1, a candidate who has failed in any paper/s may be allowed to reappear in any subsequent examination to pass the examination in that subject on receipt of the admission fee for the paper/s in each Semester examination, if any, in which he/she was appearing provided that such a candidate shall not be placed in the category of 'first division with distinction'. Mode of reappear examination will be decided by the Board of Studies (to be clarified from the Director, CIL).

- 8. Successful candidates shall the classified as under:
 - (a) those who obtain 75 per cent or more of the aggregate marks of all the Theory papers and the Sessional and also if the thesis/dissertation has been adjudged to merit distinction. Provided that the candidate cleared concerned has examination in each subject in the first attempt (i.e. the first time when a candidate actually takes the University examination in the concerned subject).

First Division with Distinction.

(b) those who obtain 60 per cent or more of the aggregate marks of all the Theory papers and the Sessional, but are not entitled to be classified as having been placed in First Division with Distinction.

ITEM 5

Regulations for Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) examination (effective from the session 2006-2007) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

- 1.1 The duration of the course of instruction for the degree of Bachelor of Dental Surgery shall be five years, including one year compulsory paid rotatory internship.
- 1.2 There shall be four examinations, viz. first, second, third and final. The first examination shall be held at the end of first year, the second examination at the end of second year, the third examination at the end of third year and the final examination at the end of fourth year.
 - After the final examination, there will be one year's compulsory paid rotatory internship
- 1.3 These examinations shall be held twice a year on suitable dates in the months of May/June and November/December or at such a time as may be decided by the appropriate University authority from time to time.
- 1.4 A person who has attained the age of 17 years, or more on 31st December of the year of admission and possesses one of the following qualifications shall be eligible to join the first year class of the course after qualifying the entrance test:-
 - (i) 10+2 examination of the Punjab School Education Board/CBSE, New Delhi with at least 50 per cent marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology, provided he/she has qualified in English of 10 + 2 standard.
 - (ii) Any examination of another University/Board, recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to 10+2 examination of Punjab School Education Board/CBSE, New Delhi with at least 50 per cent marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology provided he/she qualified in English of 10+2 standard.
- 1.5 (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 2.1 (a) A person who has passed the first BDS examination of Panjab University or an examination of any other recognized University in India considered equivalent for the purpose by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Faculty of Medical Sciences, shall be eligible to join the second year BDS class. However, a candidate who fails in the first BDS examination in the May/June examination for the first time may be allowed to attend the next higher class until December next but if he fails even in the November/December examination, he shall revert to the first BDS class.
- 2.2 A candidate who has obtained:-
 - (i) The MBBS degree of an Indian University

- (ii) any other equivalent medical qualification
- (ii) or has passed the subjects of Anatomy and Physiology

Considered equivalent for this purpose by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Faculty of Medical Sciences

of the first Professional MBBS examination of Panjab University

shall be exempted from the first BDS examination except in the subject of Dental Metallurgy.

2.3 A person who has passed the second BDS examination of Panjab University shall be eligible to join the third year BDS class.

A candidate who has passed the subjects of Pathology and Materials Medica at the:-

(i) MBBS examination of an Indian University

Or

- (ii) Any other medical qualification considered equivalent for this purpose by the Syndicate on the recommendation of Faculty of Medical Sciences, shall be exempted from the subjects of General Pathology and Bacteriology only of the second BDS examination.
- 2.4 (a) A person who has passed the third BDS examination of Panjab University shall be eligible to join the final BDS class.
 - (b) A candidate who has:-
 - (i) obtained the MBBS degree of an Indian University;

Or

- (ii) obtained any other medical qualification considered equivalent for this purpose by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Faculty of Medical Sciences shall be exempted from the subjects of Medicine and Surgery only of BDS examination. He shall, however, be examined in Dental Material Medica which shall be considered with Dental Surgery and Pathology with Dental Bacteriology all of which shall be examined in the subjects of Human Dental Anatomy, Physiology & Dental Histology, details of which are given in Regulation 4.4 against second BDS examination.
- 2.5 A person who has passed the final BDS examination of Panjab University shall be required to undergo one year's compulsory paid rotatory internship.
- 3.1 A student who possesses the qualification laid down in Regulation 2.1/2.2/2.3/2.4 and satisfy the following requirements duly certified by the Principal of Medical/Dental College affiliated to the University in the Faculty of Medical Sciences for the degree of Bachelor of Dental Surgery, shall be eligible to appear in the first/second/third/final BDS examination.
 - (a) of having been on the rolls of the College through out the academic year preceding the examination;
 - (b) of having good character;
 - (c) of having attended not less than 75 per cent of the full course
 - (i) Lectures delivered; and
 (ii) Demonstration and Practicals held Separately
 - (d) in the case of first examination of having completed dissection in detail of head and neck.
- 3.2 A candidate who has completed the prescribed course as laid down in these Regulations and is unable to appear in the examination, or having

appeared has failed, may be admitted to subsequent examination, as under on payment of the prescribed fee on each occasion and on producing a certificate signed by the Principal of the Medical/Dental College in which he completed the course, that he has, subsequent to his last failure, attended a course of training in the subjects of the examination as the Principal may determine:-

For first examination:

The candidate may be allowed to take the next three consecutive examinations. A candidate who is unable to qualify in all the three subjects in four consecutive chances, including the first chance to which he was originally entitled, shall not be allowed to continue his studies for the BDS course.

Second, Third and Final Examinations: One or more subsequent examinations.

4. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for:-

First, Second, Third And Final shall be as prescribed by the competent University Authority from time to time.

- 5.1 The minimum marks required to pass each examination shall be:-
 - (a) 50 per cent in the written part of each subject,
 - (b) 50 per cent in the oral and practical/clinical parts of each subject.
- 5.2 A candidate who obtains pass marks in one or more subjects shall be exempted from re-appear in such subjects, provided that:-
 - (a) in the case of first BDS examination, he must qualify in all the three subjects within the period prescribed in Regulation 3.2;
 - (b) in case of Second, Third and Final Examinations, he clears the whole examination within a period of two years from the time the candidate first appeared in the examination, failing which he shall have to appear in the whole examination once again.
- 6.1 Successful candidates who obtain 80 per cent marks in any subject shall be declared to have passed "with distinction" in that subject provided they pass, in all the subjects of the said examination, at one and the same time.
- 6.2 A successful candidate of the First/Second/Third examination shall be granted a Detailed Marks Certificate for each examination.
- 6.3 A successful candidate of the Final examination shall be granted degree only after completion of one year's compulsory paid rotatory internship.

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Regulations for 'Special Diploma' in Fine Arts for Deaf and Dumb/Mentally Challenged Persons (Four Year Annual System) (effective from the session 2003-04) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

- 1.1 The duration of the course for Special Diploma in Fine Arts for Deaf and Dumb/Mentally Challenged Persons shall be four years. Only four seats shall be available for the course one seat in each of the disciplines, viz., Painting Sculpture, Applied Art and Graphics (Print-Making) with the proviso that the mentally challenged persons will be eligible for seats only in the disciplines of Painting and Applied Art.
- 1.2 All the four annual examinations for the 'Special Diploma' shall be conducted by the Panjab University. These examinations will be held once a year ordinarily in the month of April or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 2.1 The minimum qualification for admission to the course shall be a pass in the Secondary School Certificate (Class 10th) conducted by the CBSE, New Delhi or an examination recognized as its equivalent by the Syndicate with a minimum score of 40% marks subject to passing the aptitude test only in the practical subject, i.e object drawing and composition painting.
- 2.2 A candidate who has obtained minimum of 45% marks in the practical of each subject and has obtained not less than 20% marks in the objective test may be admitted to a supplementary examination. Such a candidate will be required to pay fee per subject as fee for the Supplementary examination as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate. If he does not clear the objective test concerned in the Supplementary examination, he shall revert to the lower class. However, a candidate who does not obtain pass marks in any of the practical paper will be declared fail in the examination and shall be required to rejoin the course of study afresh for one academic year in order to become eligible for appearing in the examination in a subsequent year, if otherwise eligible.
- 2.3 (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 3. A candidate will be eligible to join the final year class of the course only after he has passed 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year examinations.
- 4. All the four examinations shall be open to a candidate who possesses the qualifications as laid down in Regulations 2.1 and 3 and produces a certificate signed by the Principal of the College:
 - (a) of having been on the rolls of the College affiliated for the course during the academic year preceding the examination;
 - (b) of having obtained not less than 50% marks of the total aggregate marks of sessional work in all practical subjects; and
 - (c) of having attended not less than 75% of the practical subjects in each subject during each year of the course of study. Educational trips/tours to historical and other places of educational interest organised by the College for each course of study shall count towards practical and exemption for these trips will be given by the Principal only in exceptional circumstances to be recorded.

- 5. The sessional marks awarded shall be forwarded by the Principal of the College to the University on the prescribed form at least 10 days before the commencement of the University examinations.
- 6. The minimum marks required to pass each examination to be held at the end of each year shall separately be 35% in each objective test and 45% in practicals consisting of sessional and examination marks taken together.
- 7. The final result will be compiled on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the four examinations taken together.
- 8. The successful candidates shall be classified as under:

(a)	Those who obtain 75% or more of the aggregate marks.	:	First Division with Distinction.
(b)	Those who obtain 60% or more but less than 70% of aggregate marks.	:	First Division
(c)	Those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.	:	Second Division
(d)	Those who obtain less than 50% of the aggregate marks	:	Third Division

9. A candidate who does not clear the Final examination within a period of six years of his/her admission to the first year shall not be allowed to continue his/her studies for 'Special Diploma' in Fine Arts.

Nursing (4-Year Course) (Annual System) (effective from the admissions of 2006-07) at Page 502-504 of Panjab University Calendar Volume II, 2005 in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

PRESENT REGULATIONS

1.1 The duration of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing including compulsory internship shall be four years, the first three years of which shall be divided into six semesters.

- PROPOSED REGULATIONS

 1. The duration of the course for the degree of B.Sc. Nursing (Annual System) shall be four years.
- 1.2 The examination for each semester shall ordinarily be held in the month of November/December and April/May on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate. A candidate who does not qualify in all the subjects of the preceding two semesters, even at the supplementary examination, but qualifies in 50% of the subjects in aggregate, shall have another chance of reappearing in the subjects in which the candidate has failed along with the current semester examination.
- After a candidate has passed the Sixth semester examination, there shall a compulsory internship of one year as described in Regulation 9.1.
- 2. The examination shall ordinarily be held in the month of April/May of each year or on such other dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate. A candidate failing in more than two subjects and/or nursing practical will not be promoted to next higher class. Maximum number attempts permitted for each paper shall be three (first examination, reappear examination and along with next higher class examination). Candidate shall not be admitted to subsequent higher examination unless the candidate has passed the lower examination (e.g. cleared all first year subjects exams for 3rd appearing in year examination/2nd subjects year examinations for appearing 4th year subject examination). The candidate has to pass both theory and practical examinations separately in each of the paper. The candidate, failing in either theory or practical paper, has to re-appear for both theory and practical examinations. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
- 1.3 The last dates for receipt of examination admission forms and fees without late fees and with late fees of Rs.5, as fixed by the Syndicate shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 3. (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees
 and other charges shall be as
 decided by the
 Syndicate/Senate from time to
 time.
 - (c)The last dates for receipt of examination admission forms and fees, without late fees and with late fees, as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time, shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 2 A person who has passed one of the following examination and has attained/shall attain the minimum age of 17 years on December 31 of the year
- 4. A person who has passed 10+2 with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology with 50% aggregate marks from the recognized Board or

(a) Pre-Medical examination of the Panjab University

or

- (b) An examination of another University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a)
- 3.1 The examination for the first semester shall be open to a student who has passed the examination laid down in Regulation 2. The examination for Second/Third/ Fourth/Fifth/Sixth semester shall be open to a student who has qualified in the First/Second/Third/Fourth/Fifth semester as laid down in these regulations.

A candidate for an examination for any Semester shall produce the following certificates signed by the Principal of the Nursing College affiliated to the University for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing:-

- (i) of having been on the rolls of the college during the semester preceding the examination
- (ii) of good character
- (iii) of having attended not less than 75 per cent of lectures and practicals held in each of the subject and 90 per cent of clinical practices in nursing subjects in which she wishes to be examined and
- (iv) of possessing good health.
- 3.2 The Principal of the college shall have authority to condone shortage in attendances at lectures and practicals to the extent of 10 per cent.
- 3.3 A candidate who having attended the prescribed number of lectures and practicals fails to pass or present herself for the examination may be allowed to appear in the next two consecutive semester examinations without attending a fresh course.
- 4 The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each semester examination shall be as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time.

A candidate on reappearing shall pay admission fee per subject in each semester examination subject to a maximum fee prescribed for the examination concerned and the any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to it shall be eligible to join the course. However, a person of less than 17 years and more than 25 years of age on December 31 of the year of admission shall not be eligible to join the course.

5 The examination for the first year shall be open to a student who has passed the examination laid down in Regulation 4.

The candidate who passes all the four years examination shall be eligible for the award of degree in Nursing.

Regulations under Five-Year integrated Programme in Economics – B.A. (Honours School) in Economics (three-year/six semester) followed by two years/four semester M.A. Honours School in Economics, in Department of Economics at the Panjab University Campus (effective from the session 2006-07) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies of the University/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

- 1. The duration of the course will be Five -Years [B A Honours School in Economics (Three -years /Six Semesters) followed by Two Year/Four Semester M A Honours School in Economics] with the following provision:
 - (i) B A Honours School in Economics (Three -years /Six Semesters) with option to opt out of the course after graduation; and
 - (ii) Two Year/Four Semester M A Honours School in Economics (Majoring* in)

*Specializations would be recommended by the Board of Control and decided by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

- 2. A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible for admission to the first semester of the Five-Year Integrated Programme in Economics:
 - (i) +2 Examination under 10+2+3 system of education conducted by a recognized Board/ University/Council with at least 60 per cent (55 per cent in case of SC/ST candidates) marks in the +2 examination.
 - (ii) Any other examination, recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) above.
 - (iii) Only those students who (i) earn the stipulated 120 credits in the first six semesters by the end of three year term with effect from their date of admission to Unit-I of the programmme (i.e. admission to Semester-I). OR (ii) earn the stipulated 120 credits by the end of a four-year term, with 55 per cent or more marks, starting with their admission to Semester-I, OR (iii) earn 120 credits by the end of a five-year period (the maximum time permitted for the Unit), with 60 per cent or more marks shall be allowed to enter Unit-II of the programme, commencing with Semester-VII of the programme.
- 3. (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges, for a semester and thesis/dissertation examination to be paid by the candidates shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.

While awarding grace marks, fraction working to ½ or more will be rounded to a whole.

Provided that grace marks will also be awarded to a candidate if by awarding such marks he can earn exemption or compartment in subject/s and part/s.

(ii) Grace marks up to 1 per cent of the total marks of an examination including its part/s, if any, shall be added to the total marks secured by a candidate for the award of higher class (and not for earning distinction/honours); provided that no grace marks have already been availed of for passing the examination.

Provided that no candidate shall be given more marks than the minimum that may be required for securing the higher division.

8. No student shall be allowed to spend more than a maximum of five years, from the date of admission to the programme, for completion of Unit-I i.e. B A Honours School in Economics. However, he/she must clear all the Re-appears and earn the stipulated number of credits i.e. 120 credits, to qualify for the award of B.A. Honours School in Economics Degree. The re-appear examination will be held along with the regular Semester examinations as per the syllabi in operation.

A student who fails to earn the stipulated 120 credits for Unit-I in the maximum period specified above (i.e. five years) may be awarded B A Pass degree (without any division) provided he/she has earned a minimum of 100 credits in Unit-I of the programme.

A student earning less than 100 credits, in spite of having spent five years in the programme, will be declared as 'failed'.

- 9. (i) A student will be required to obtain 40% marks in each course/paper to be declared pass.
 - (ii) A student failing to earn total 20 credits in Semester-I examination will get promoted to Semester –II only if he/she has

earned a minimum of 12 credits. A student who earns less than 12 credits in Semester-I shall be declared a 'failed' candidate and would be asked to quit the programme. Such student will not be eligible for re-admission to the Programme.

- (iii) A student admitted to the second unit of the programme would be allowed to undertake 'on-the-job training', scheduled for semester-X of the Programme, provided he/she has earned a minimum of 40 credits by the end of Semester –IX in Unit-II.
- (iv) A student who fails to earn a minimum of 40 credits, as specified above, shall be detained in Semester-IX and would be allowed to undertake 'on-the-job training' only with the following batch next year, provided that he/she has earned the stipulated minimum 40 credits by that time. No student shall be allowed to spend more than a maximum of Two and a half (2.5) years from his/her admission to semester-VII, for earning a minimum of 40 credits before undertaking 'On-the-job training' in semester-X.
- (v) If a student fails to earn a minimum 40 credits even after spending another year, as specified above. He/she will be allowed to proceed further with 'on-the-job training'. Such a student would be allowed an 'Additional chance' to clear the back-log of credits along with his/her 'on-the-job training'.
- (vi) A student unable to clear the entire back-log or clearing it partially, even having availed of the 'Additional chance' would be recommended for the award of **MA (Majoring in) without Division**, provided he/she has earned a minimum of 60 credits (including credits for 'on-the-job training')at the end of Semester-X.
- (vii) A student, who 'fails to earn the minimum 60 credits at the end of Semester-X, would be declared as 'failed'. Such a student would not be re-inducted into the Programme.
- (viii) On having completed 'on-the-job-training' in semester X, a candidate who earns 80 credits shall be declared successful. The successful candidates would be awarded division as detailed in Regulation 6.
- 10. A student who has attended a minimum of 75 per cent lectures delivered, student seminars and Tutorials etc. held will be eligible for appearing in the end-semester examination.

Regulations for M. Pharmacy examination (Annual System) (effective from the session 2003-2004) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in Government of India Gazette.

- 1. The duration of the course of instructions for the degree of Master of Pharmacy shall be of 2 years.
- 2. A person who holds valid GATE* score and has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible for admission to the first year of Master of Pharmacy course:
 - (a) B.Pharm. examination of the Panjab University.
 - An examination of another University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) above..
 - Relaxable on the recommendation of Board of Control and subsequent approval by the D.U.I. in cases of admission to Foreign/NRI/NRI-Sponsored/Pharmaceutical Industry sponsored categories.
- 3.1 The examination involving theory and laboratory courses will be held at the end of first year and the examination involving a dissertation on a research project allotted after the first year and presentation of the work at a seminar will be held at the end of second year.
- 3.2 (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges shall be as decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 4.1 The examination for M.Pharm. 1st year shall ordinarily be held in April/May or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate. The Supplementary examination shall ordinarily be held after one month of declaration of result of M.Pharm. 1st year examination.
- 4.2(a) The examination in M.Pharm. 1st year shall consist of four theory papers and one practical in groups specified in the syllabus.
 - (b) The examination in M.Pharm. 2nd year shall consist of evaluation of the submitted dissertation and its presentation at a seminar on a date fixed by the Chairperson of the Institute. The external examiners, members of the teaching staff and research students of the Institute shall participate in the discussion on the dissertation.
- 4.3 A student who possesses qualifications laid down in Regulation 2, has been enrolled in the University Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and produces the following certificates signed by the Chairperson of the Institute, shall be eligible for appearing in M.Pharm. 1st year examination:
 - (a) of good character
 - (b) Candidate having attended a minimum of 75% of contact hours in each theory paper and practicals including tutorials/workshops/ seminars/ field work, etc.
- 4.4 The minimum number of marks required to pass in each theory paper and practical of M.Pharm. I year shall be 50%.
- 5.1 A candidate who having attended the course of instructions for M.Pharm. I year in terms of Regulation 4.3 (a) /4.4 does not appear in all or any of the papers in the examinations that follow it or has failed

to pass in all or any of the papers therein may be allowed to appear in the next three consecutive examinations from the date of eligibility. If the candidate does not clear the examination in four consecutive chances thus provided, he/she shall not be allowed to continue studies for the degree of Master of Pharmacy. The result of higher examination shall not be declared till declaration of the result of lower examination.

- 5.2 The seminar of a candidate whose dissertation for M.Pharm. 2nd year examination has been rejected (scoring less than 50% marks in the evaluation of dissertation), shall not be held. However, the candidate may be allowed to resubmit a revised dissertation after a period of three months from the date of declaration of result but not later than one year of the first submission of the dissertation.

Regulations for M.Sc. (Solid Waste Management) (Semester System) (effective from the session 2006-07) in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/publication in the Government of India Gazette.

- 1. (i) The course comprises 4 semesters (2-years). The first and the third semesters shall be from June/July to November/December and the second from December/ January to May/June, respectively or as decided by the Syndicate. The instructional period for each semester will extend over a period of at least 16 weeks followed by preparatory holidays for not more than one week prior to the semester examinations.
 - (ii) The final examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester in the courses offered in that semester only.
 - (iii) A student who does not appear for any reason or fails in a paper/papers in any semester shall be eligible to take the examination(s) along with the respective examination(s) of the regular students of the next year batch. In no case, the University will hold special examination for such failed students.
- 2. The graduates from science/engineering stream from Panjab University with minimum 50% marks or any other University recognized as equivalent by the Panjab University shall be eligible for admission to the course.
- 3. To be eligible to take the examination, a candidate has to attend prescribed minimum number of lectures in the respective paper/course as per the rules of the University.

- 4. (a) The examination fee shall be decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
 - (b) The amount of admission fees and other charges shall be as decided by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 5. To qualify for the award of the Post-graduate degree of the Faculty of Science in Solid Waste Management i.e. M.Sc. (Solid Waste Management), a candidate has to successfully complete the course work and obtain at least 50% marks in aggregate (including internal continuous assessment) and 40% marks in each course separately in theory (including the internal continuous assessment) and Practical/Assignment. The students who fail to pass any paper(s) in the first attempt will be allowed to take up immediately next two consecutive chances. In other words, the candidate who failed in the reappear shall not be entitled for the award of the degree.
- 6. The maximum marks for final examination of each theory and Practical/Assignment paper shall be 80 and 50, respectively. The internal assessment for each theory paper shall be 20 marks. These shall be reflected in the final award sheet issued by the University after the semester examination.
- 7. To qualify for the grant of credits for a particular course, a candidate must get at least the pass marks. If the candidate fails in a course or does not take the examination, he/she will not get the credit for it. He/she may repeat the course as a regular student in which he/she failed or did not appear, whenever offered next or may appear in the examination as a private student without attending the classes again provided he/she satisfied the attendance clause as a regular student.
- 8. The evaluation of each course will be on the basis of the University examination at the end of each semester and the continuous internal assessment as prescribed. The University examination will be held according to the outlines of the test, syllabi and course of reading as approved by the competent body from time to time.
- 9. The examination for each semester shall be open to a candidate who fulfils the requirements of qualifications as laid down in Regulations 5 and 6 of Panjab University Calendar and produces the following certificates from the Chairperson/convener of the Board of Control/Advisory Committee:
 - That he/she has been on rolls of the department/centre for the semester preceding the examination.
 - That he/she has attended the prescribed number of lectures as per the **University rules.**
- 10. The condonation of deficiency in lectures, if any, can be considered only as per the existing rules applicable for other M.Sc. (2-Year) (Semester System) courses.
- 11. A student who does not fulfil the attendance requirement, for any reason, for any paper will have to repeat the study in that paper, whenever offered next.
- 12. The student shall submit her/his examination form for each semester examination through the Chairman Board of Control/Convener Advisory Committee to the Controller of Examinations, before the examination with prescribed fee/dues, as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate.
- 13. The amount of examination fee shall have to be paid by the student at the rates prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.

- 14. The successful candidates shall be classified into three categories: (a) Distinction: above 75% marks, (b) First Division: between 60 and 75% marks and (c) Second Division: between 50 and 60% marks obtained in aggregate.
- 15. To maintain transparency in the system of evaluation, the candidates could be shown their respective answer scripts and signatures obtained.
- 16. The marks obtained in the internal assessment shall be shown separately in the final Detailed Marks Card.
- 17. The attendance of the candidates shall also be shown in their respective Detailed Marks Card at the end of the semester.
- 18. The paper-setters and evaluators shall be from the Panjab University, preferably from among those who teach the respective papers. For evaluation of Projects and Seminars, experts from outside the department or the University could be invited as external examiners along with the internal examiner(s).
